MR. HIROSHI YAGUCHI
President of IAFEI, Founder & Executive Director of Japan Association for CFOs

Hiroshi Yaguchi helped establish the CFO Headquarters Co., Ltd. in 2000 and served as its president. He then co-founded the Japan Association of Chief Financial Officers (JACFO) where he served as a Member of the Board until he was appointed its Executive Director since 2003.

Mr. Yaguchi earned his degree at the University of Tokyo, Department of Economics. He joined Sumitomo Bank in 1989 and became the Deputy Chief of Personnel Department in 1996. He served as the Deputy Manager of Hibiya Branch and was selected as the Deputy Chief of Corporate Department in 1999.

Mr. Jin Liqun
Chairman, Supervisory Board, CIC

Mr. Jin Liqun is the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of CIC. Prior to this appointment he served as the Vice President (Operations 1) of the Asian Development Bank (ADB). Before joining the ADB in August 2003, he served as Deputy Minister of Finance, Director General of the World Bank Department at the Ministry of Finance, and Executive Deputy Director of China to the World Bank Group. He was a member of the Monetary Policy Committee of the People's Bank of China. Currently he also serves as Chair of the International Forum of Sovereign Wealth Fund.

Mr. Jin was born in 1949 and holds a masters degree from Beijing Foreign Studies University, and was a Hubert Humphrey Fellow in the Economics Graduate Program at Boston University.

Mr. TOYOO GYOHTEN
President, Japan Association for Chief Financial Officers

Born in Yokohama, Japan, in 1931, Mr. Gyohten graduated from the University of Tokyo in 1955 with a BA in Economics.

Joining the Japanese Ministry of finance, Tax Bureau in 1955, he studied at the Economics and Sociology Department, Graduate School, Princeton University on a Fulbright Scholarship (1956-58). His 34-year career at the Ministry also includes five years of experience overseas at the IMF and the Asian Development Bank where he was one of the founding members and served as Special Assistant to the President.

After returning to Tokyo, he became Director of the

Public Loan and Investment Department, Finance Bureau. Having been Deputy Director-General of the International Finance Bureau and the Banking Bureau, he was later appointed Director General of the International Finance Bureau. From 1986, he took up the post of Vice-Minister of Finance for International Affairs until his retirement from the Ministry in 1989.

He was Chairman of Working Party, OECD (1988-90) and Visiting Professor at Harvard University, Princeton University and the University of St. Gallen (1990-91). In 1991, he joined the Bank of Tokyo, and was elected Chairman in 1992. Since 1995, he has been the President of the Institute for International Monetary Affairs. In 1996, he became Senior Advisor of the Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi, Ltd. in Oct. 2000. He joined Japan Association for Chief Financial Officers as the first President on its inception.

Mr. Wei Jiafu became President and CEO of China Ocean Shipping (Group) Company (COSCO Group) in November 1998. Prior to that, he had been managing directors in many COSCO subsidiaries both at home and abroad, and in charge of corporate asset operation and management as a key member in the top management. In 1993, as President of COSCO (Singapore) Ltd, Mr. Wei managed to transform his company into a public listed company by acquisition, marking COSCO's first step into the international capital market.

With nearly twenty years sailing history and as a well-experienced ship's master, Mr. Wei Jiafu

has rich knowledge in international shipping management and operation. He is a senior engineer with a doctoral degree in naval architecture and a master's degree in shipping management.

As President and CEO of COSCO, Mr. Wei has been crowned with a number of distinguished awards over past years in honor of his outstanding contributions to the international shipping industry. In Dec. 2009, He was awarded the honorary title of "Outstanding Business Leaders in Ten Years" by CCTV.

Mr. Wei was elected member of the CPC Central Committee for Discipline Inspection in Nov. 2002 and Oct. 2007 at the 16th and 17th National Congress of the Communist Party of China.
